Call for papers for a 2-day WORKSHOP of the Centre for Social Data Analytics (CSDA)

Empirical Economic Papers on Children and Youth

February 21-22, 2017, in New Zealand

Newly established, the Centre for Social Data Analytics is conducting research that addresses and informs social issues or challenges in core policy areas including Education, Health, Justice and Social Services. The Centre has access to comprehensive linked administrative data available in New Zealand (the Integrated Data Infrastructure). We collaborate with academic researchers from various universities and institutes across the globe, as well as with institutional researchers from NGOs and government agencies within New Zealand.

The meeting will last for two days starting in the morning on Tuesday February 21st, and ending with lunch on February 22nd. The workshop will take place at the Bolton Hotel in Wellington. The organizers will cover workshop fees and the workshop dinner, while participants will have to cover travel costs and accommodation themselves (*accommodation might be covered*).

The number of participants is limited to 40, and we expect to have 10-12 presentations. We invite empirical economic papers on issues relating to children and youth in general. The keynote speakers are **Abigail Payne** (Melbourne Institute of Applied Economic and Social Research) and **Michael Rosholm** (Aarhus University, TrygFondens Centre for Child Research).

Submitted papers should be sent to Bénédicte Rouland, benedicte.rouland@aut.ac.nz, by **December 4th 2016**. The organizers will communicate the acceptance decisions shortly hereafter. For those interested in participating without presenting, we also need a tentative indication of interest by December 4th 2016.
